

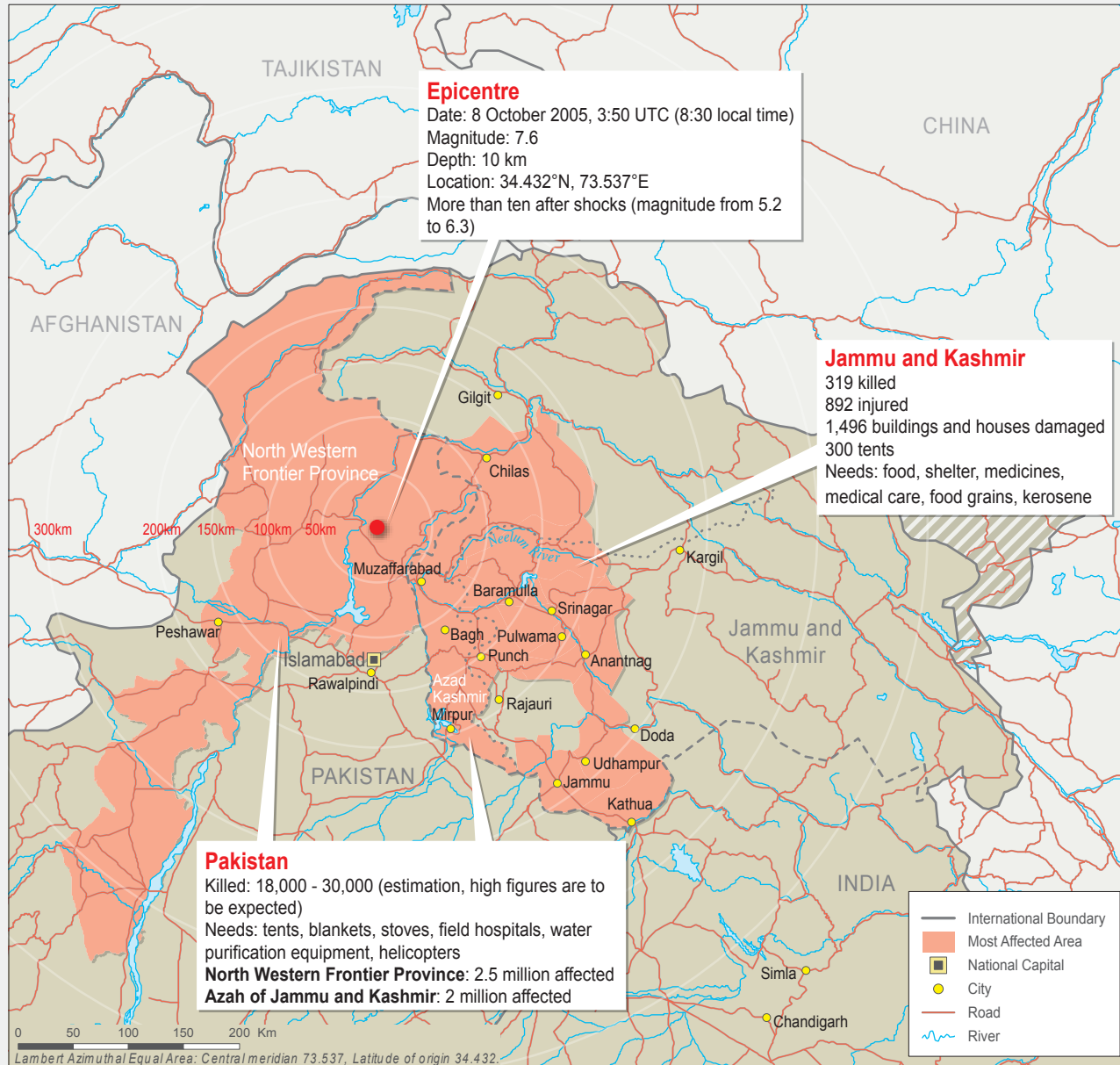

 More than ten after shocks (magnitude from 5.2 to 6.3)

Jammu and Kashmir
 319 killed
 892 injured
 1,496 buildings and houses damaged
 300 tents
 Needs: food, shelter, medicines, medical care, food grains, kerosene

Pakistan
 Killed: 18,000 - 30,000 (estimation, high figures are to be expected)
 Needs: tents, blankets, stoves, field hospitals, water purification equipment, helicopters
North Western Frontier Province: 2.5 million affected
Azad Jammu and Kashmir: 2 million affected
